



THE HIGH COUNTRY RAT RACE

The High Country Rat Race began in 1953 when George and Grace Thompson, along with two other couples, decided to create a social event where couples from various clubs in Eastern Oregon could get together for some golf, dinner and dancing.

According to Mona Williams, the first tournament was played on sand greens. On one of the Par 3 holes a 50-gallon barrel ring was set in the sand for the hole. Also, the runner-up received an "award" that was one half of a toilet seat - the "Half Assed" award. It sounds like they had a lot of fun!

Eventually, the crazy putting contest, the sole survivor contest, the best ball contest and the mini tournament replaced the dancing. The Saturday night dinner is still a big part of the tournament.

This year's event was August 30-September 1. Ninety-four golfers made forty-seven two-person teams. Golfers came from Baker City, Echo, Enterprise, Hermiston, Joseph, La Grande, Pendleton, Tri Cities, Troutdale, Stanfield, Walla Walla, Wallowa and as far away as Idaho, Utah and Arizona to participate in this fun weekend.

The Saturday night dinner included beef brisket from Z's BBQ with all the sides, rolls and dessert prepared by Belinda Kuntz and Mona Williams. Bill Williams, Belinda and Mona were the servers and cleanup crew!

Also included in the fun was a raffle with over 50 items, mostly from local businesses and some donations from players and participants with values from \$25-\$500. This year three \$100 bills were hidden in three of the items. The lucky winners were Rachel Jones, Joan Hollstrom (Troutdale) and Stormie McCarthy (La Grande). Kathy Reynolds won the 50/50 pot taking home over \$300.

Alpine Meadows Golf Course received \$11,095 from the Rat Race proceeds plus \$5,000-\$6,000 from cart rentals, the bar and pro-shop proceeds making the total for the three-day weekend between \$16,000-\$17,000.

Many volunteers helped make the event such a success. Erin Taggert and Ashley Imoos from Helping Hearts worked all day on Friday with registration. A big thank you goes to the Lady Golfers. Judy Ables and Kathy Reynolds organized the food for the Friday night "Meet and Greet." Donna McCadden volunteered on Saturday to sell the lunch that consisted of chicken/bacon Caesar wraps, chips and cookies.

Belinda helped out all weekend with whatever was needed -- food, registration, cleanup, etc. Sylvia Marcum made breakfast burritos that were a big hit. Scott Marcum did all the scoring and ran the soul survivor tournament. Bob and Cindy Williams announced the winners of the raffle, making that a fun event.



Last, but by no means least, a big thank you to Greg Oveson, JD Hagen and Wyatt Nash for their work throughout the season and especially during the Rat Race assuring that the course was in pristine condition.

Mona said, "We received many comments from players who have attended this tournament for years, saying that the course was in the best shape it had ever been".
